National <i>2 Coverages</i>	<p>Police in Melbourne have arrested 74 people in more coronavirus anti-lockdown protests.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approximately 250 protesters chanting “Freedom” and “Power to the people” were encircled by officers at Queen Victoria Market. • some protesters were seen taking fruit from market stalls and throwing it at the Police. • Footage of violent scuffles between protestors and police was posted online. <p>A database of 2.4 million people, including more than 35,000 Australians, has been leaked from a Chinese company - Zhenhua Data.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The company which created the database has links to China's government and military. • Information collected includes dates of birth, addresses, marital status, along with photographs, political associations, relatives and social media IDs. • Much of the information from public sources like social media, but some of it is more personal and the company is believed to have sourced it from the "dark web". • The leaked database raises further questions about the spread and scope of China's intelligence gathering operations.
Victoria <i>3 Coverages</i>	<p>Victoria has recorded 35 new coronavirus cases and 6 further deaths overnight.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The data originally reported 7 deaths but the Victorian Premier confirmed one was a duplication. <p>Yesterday, Premier Daniel Andrews announced a \$3 billion support package to help Victorians businesses affected by coronavirus restrictions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The support includes cash grants, tax relief and cashflow support. • Coronavirus restrictions have slightly eased in Victoria. • Exercise can now be done out of the home for up to two hours, split over a maximum of two sessions.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • you can use outdoor playgrounds and outdoor fitness equipment again. • But you must continue to maintain 1.5 metre distance from anyone outside of your household. • The night time curfew is now an hour shorter and will begin at 9pm each night. • For Melburnians who live alone, there is now the opportunity to create a “social bubble” with one other person. • For more information on the rules around “social bubbles”: https://www.abc.net.au/news/2020-09-06/victorian-roadmap-allows-single-household-single-parent-bubbles/12635082 <p>Due to the lower case numbers in regional Victoria, the restrictions are more relaxed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Public gatherings of up to five people from up to two households are allowed (babies under 12 months old are not counted in that limit). - Outdoor religious gatherings of up to five people and one faith leader are allowed. - Playgrounds and outdoor pools are open.
Tasmania <i>1 Coverages</i>	<p>The Tasmanian Government has launched a \$100m process to build up to 1000 new homes over the next three years.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The initiative is aimed at increasing the supply of social and affordable housing across Tasmania. • The Government says building the homes will support jobs in Tasmania’s building and construction sector.
